A Reflection on Ash Wednesday



On Ash Wednesday, I had the privilege of imposing ashes on the foreheads of others for the first time. While this particular service is one that I have attended every year since I can remember, this is the first time that my role changed. For years, I have been the recipient of ashes. For years, I have been reminded of my mortality as the ashen cross placed on my own forehead made visible the cross placed on my head at baptism.

As I was making my way down the altar rail, I came face to face with a family. First ashes on the father, then the mother, and quietly I asked, "Would you like ashes for your child?" She responded with a gentle nod of her head. As I dipped my thumb first in the oil, then the ashes, I made a vertical line followed by a horizontal one; all I could see was this black dust on the canvas of something so innocent, so pure.

This image has stayed with me as I have begun my journey into the 40-day season of Lent. In this child, I saw mortality and new birth, penitence and innocence. In this child, I saw the paradox that we struggle with that is our faith: we die to be born in Baptism; we die to be born to eternal life.

As we continue our Lenten journey, I invite us to wonder-what does it mean for us to be marked with a cross of ashes as we begin our own journey to Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter?

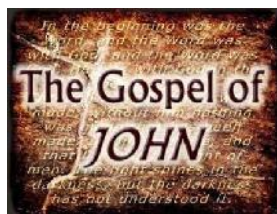

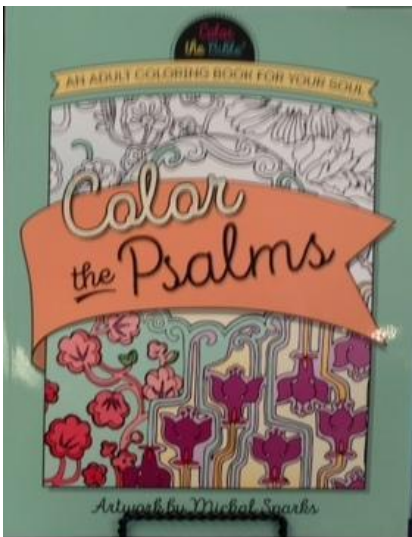
