

This Summer Adult Education offering, "Music of Our Lives", meets each Sunday through August 28 at 9:30 in the Activity Center.

Adult Christian Education: "Music of Our Lives"

On Sunday mornings this summer, our Adult Education offering, "Music of Our Lives", considers a different popular music song each week. We listen to the song as we read its lyrics and then we have a conversation about the song and what it might be saying about our relationships with each other and with God.

This **Sunday, August 7**, we will listen to a song that was recorded about fifteen miles from here, at Stax Studios, in November 1967. This week's song is "**The Dock of the Bay**" by the legendary singer-songwriter Otis Redding. Please grab a cup of coffee and join us in the Activity Center on Sunday at 9:30 to listen to and talk about this memorable song by this remarkable singer.

Then, on **August 14**, our focus goes from a song recorded in Memphis to one that was recorded in Dublin. The song for that Sunday will be "**I Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For**" by the Irish rock band U2. Plan to be with us on the 14th as we hear a song about someone's searching and talk about the searching that takes place in our own lives.

Each Sunday morning visit to "Music of Our Lives" provides the chance to listen to a song with others and to enjoy a conversation about the ways that our daily music impacts our thoughts and attitudes. You are invited to join us at 9:30 each Sunday in the Activity Center.

Mother Dorothy's Musings

For many of us, the month of August means a return from a more leisurely, relaxing summer schedule to a fuller calendar and many more activities. Whether we are ourselves students, have children in school, or simply allow ourselves a more relaxing summer pace, August tends to become that time when we pick up the pace a bit and often find new projects in which to engage.

The life of the Church seems to follow this schedule.

Come August, we begin again here at St. George's with new opportunities to Gather, Discover and Serve. And today, I write you, hoping that in the coming weeks, all of us will take advantage of some new opportunity to continue to grow as Christians here at St. George's.

Families will have the first opportunity to gather together on August 10, as The Table returns. We invite all families of children and youth to join us at 6:30 that evening for a shared meal and time of learning. August 14 brings the opportunity for families to meet and greet our Sunday School teachers in the classrooms at 9:30. Later that morning, the Blessing of the Backpacks will follow the morning announcements, just before the 10:30 a.m. service, and EYC will kick off that afternoon.

Labor of Love is coming up on Labor Day - Monday, September 5. In addition to the service opportunities that we have had in previous years partnering with MIFA, we are adding a new opportunity this year - to package meals for the Memphis Feeds Initiative. We need lots of hearts and hands to continue to make this day a successful one, and we invite everyone to join neighbors and friends for this wonderful day during which we will serve our community.

The following evening, September 6, at 7:00 p.m., we will host a marvelous interfaith dialogue between Christian, Jewish and Muslim leaders in our community called, "The Children of Abraham." We pray that this will be an enlightening evening for our entire community, as we seek to understand how we can learn from our shared patriarch, Abraham, how to create more and better opportunities for dialogue and unity. This time of learning is just one of many opportunities - The Forum, book and Bible studies, and other community conversations - coming to us here to help us in our own growth in Christ.

And that's just the beginning.

We learn from the Catechism that the ministry of lay persons is "to represent Christ and his Church; to bear witness to him wherever [we] may be; and, according to the gifts given [us], to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take [our] place in the life, worship and governance of the Church." In the coming days, each of us will receive a mailing at our homes, outlining ways in which we do all of these things - and grow in our own faith - here at St. George's. I ask that you prayerfully consider all of the opportunities for growth that are present in this place - and find your place among them.

Labor of Love 2016 is coming up on Monday, September 5, 2016 8 a.m. to 12 noon! Along with Germantown Methodist, Germantown Presbyterian, Kingsway Christian

Education for Ministry Now Enrolling New and Continuing Members

Have you ever thought about what your unique call to ministry might look like? Are you searching for a greater knowledge of Christianity and what it means to be a Christian in the 21st century? Do you long for a place of community where discovery, challenge and support walk hand in hand? Then Education for Ministry (EfM) may be just what you're looking for!

This small group program (limited to 12 participants) meets on Mondays from 6:45-8:45 PM from September-May. EfM participants share, learn, worship, and discern where God might be calling them-all in community.

It is a four-year course but commitment is year by year as fits your needs and schedule and fees cover the costs of the materials and material development.

Growing Our Faith: Adult Formation at St. George's Episcopal Church Coming this Fall 2016

Sunday mornings, at The Forum (9:30 a.m.)

September 11 - October 2 - The Biblical God of

Justice: From the beginning of the world, God has called humankind to use the gifts that God has given us in ways that seek justice, that care for all creation, and that recognize our interdependence. Join us as we take a scriptural look at God and God's view of justice in our world - with Biblical stories, and stories of our modern times.

October 9 - October 30 - People of the Book - Many human hands have been involved in bringing the divinely-inspired Word of God to us in our modern age - from scribes, to translators, to councils who selected the texts that have been included in our Bible. Bart Ehrman's 2005 best seller, *Misquoting Jesus*, raises questions about what is included in the New Testament, and what is not. We'll take a look at some of the questions that he raises.

November 13, 20, 27, December 4 - Lessons from The Faith Club - The world into which Jesus was born was a world in which Judaism - the faith of Mary and Joseph - lived alongside the pagan worship of the Roman Empire. How do we in our incarnational bodies live alongside those who hold other beliefs? A look at the dialogue between mothers in Ranya Iliby's *The Faith Club* - and the lessons for us as Christians seeking to love our neighbors.

PARISH NOTES

There are many opportunities where your time and talent (skills) are need in support of our church and outreach programs:

Worship Transportation Ministry - coordinator needed, estimated time required each month = less than 1 hour (to send emails to drivers and create the schedule)

Parish Fellowship Teams - 4 teams needed to set-up, decorate and clean up for our four large parish events: Pentecost Picnic, Summer Ice Cream Social, Stewardship Ingathering Luncheon, Confirmation Sunday. Estimated time required per event = 2-3 hours

Sunday School Teachers - for our children and youth, estimated time required: less than 2 hours per Sunday of teaching (lesson review and teaching)

Children's Chapel Leaders - Bring the Sunday lesson to our youngest children using prepared lessons and activities; estimated time required: less than ½ hour each Sunday.

The Table - Pick up prepared food for the meal, prepare simple craft or lesson for younger children; estimated time required = 30 minutes, one hour any week, plus an hour at The Table.

EYC/Youth - Prepare dinner for our youth on Sunday evenings and assist youth leader with the group; estimated time required: prep and cooking time (or pick up) and/or two hours per Sunday with our youth.

Labor of Love - Coming Monday, Sept 5; sign up now to help deliver MIFA meals, fill bags for MIFA's Emergency Services, clean yards, and/or package food for MidSouth Food Bank Memphis Feeds Initiative. Also needed: 2 greeters for the welcome session at St. George's, 2 persons to distribute meals and meal routes to volunteer drivers, 3 table leaders for food packaging at New Bethel church. Estimated time required = ½ to 3 hours depending on the work you choose for the day.

Room in the Inn 2016 - On the 1st & 3rd Thursday evenings, Nov. - March we'll need van drivers, second seat riders in the van, and overnight shepherds; we also need persons to help set-up at The Cottage, prepare meals, bring items for to-go bags, launder bedding at home and return them to the church. Estimated time required per week: 2 - 3 hours for set-up team or drivers, up to 10+ hours for overnight shepherds.
