### **Padre's Postings**



#### **LENT: A TIME TO REPENT SO THAT GOD MAY RENEW**

Lent! Lent! The very word for most of us conjures up thoughts of "giving up goodies", making some changes, repenting, turning our lives around, doing some soul-searching, re-assessing our priorities, slowing down and catching our breath. All of which would serve us well spiritually, mentally, and physically.

Over the years, Lent, for me, has taken on the form of "attitude adjustment", both toward myself, toward others, and toward "things" that have a way of accumulating in my life. A few Sundays ago, the Gospel lesson presented us with the "Beatitudes"- the

"be happy attitudes", as Dr. Schaeffer called them. Lent offers me the very real possibilities for making some often needed attitude changes, so that those Kingdom based ways of living may find themselves more and more incorporated into my life.

You and I really do want to know the joys of resurrections and Easters in our lives. For the most part, experiencing those joys comes about because we have first been able to turn over, hand over, yield our troubles, pride, selfishness, and other "attitudes" to God, so that like a good potter, he can re-shape us into more useful vessels.

Another major factor that Lent leads me to look at, is at the base of all that can hinder my knowing the joys of Easter moments in my future, and that is "change". I can be so stubbornly resistant to making those "changes", those "attitude adjustments", even when I know that my old ways of doing and thinking are NOT really "working" for me or for others in my life. Again, it boils down to a matter of my trust level with God.

So what keeps you and me from experiencing those Easter possibilities? I know that for me, it is sometimes the "fear of letting go"- the fear that I may lose some of my "controlling ways" and I cannot see what the future may bring. In short, I fail to trust that God knows (not I) what is best for me, and will show me what paths I need to walk in. Lent gives me some time to build on my trust level with God.

Lent offers us a good forty days to do some assessing and make some adjustments. May the changes we intend to make this Lent really get our attention, break our routine, and be worth the price of building up our "wholeness of body, mind, and spirit", so that we may be more fit and useful instruments for building up God's kingdom in this world.

Lenten blessings to give us "strength and courage",



### DOK Can Recycling

Some years back the Daughters of the King set up a Recycling Can Collection station in the back hallway to recycle cans discarded at church in a way to benefit the environment and the local Humane Society. At that time we also encouraged parishioners to drop off their cans. However, excess bags of cans that cannot be fitted into the containers is both unsightly and creates an attraction for insects and rodents. We thank those who have participated in this project. However, because there are now many more

opportunities for personal recycling through curbside neighborhood pick up or recycling centers, we ask that you handle your personal recycling through other means. If you wish to donate cans to the Memphis Humane Society, the collection trailer is parked at the Humane Society on Farm Road in Shelby Farms Park and is easy to use (Cans must be bagged.). There are also large recycling trailers at the Agricultural Center if not available in your neighborhood. DOK will continue to collect and recycle cans left at the church from group events.
