America is part of a very large world. We have to study and learn about America because we all live here. We should know about where we live. I



## Words 219-224: Eyes to See When there is light


Potatoes and carrots are found <u>under</u> the <u>earth</u>.

I knew I had a problem when my mother gave me some paper with numbers and said,




"Complete these problems."
