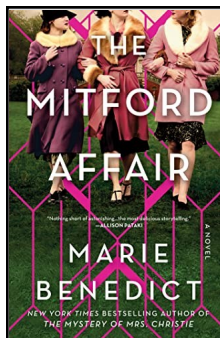


Memphis

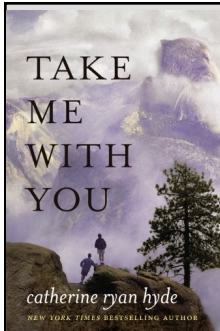


The Mitford Affair

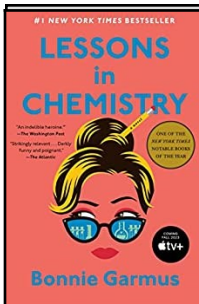
St. George's Book Club

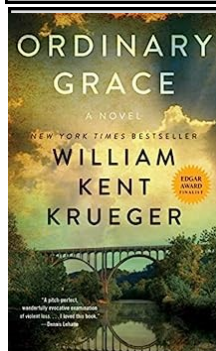


Lessons in Chemistry

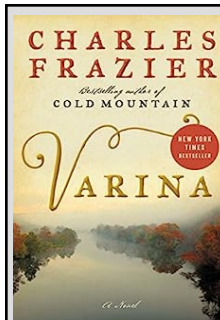


Ordinary Grace

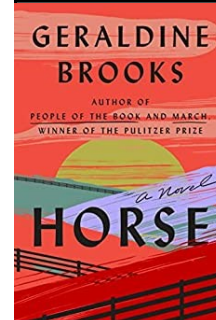


Varina

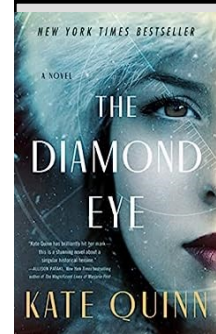


Horse
